Monitored smoke detector

Bupa's smoke detector is constantly monitored, 24 hours a day. As soon as smoke is detected, the Fire Service is alerted.



Betty has mild dementia. Her family worries that she might leave a pot cooking on the stove, and cause a fire. With her Bupa smoke detector both Betty and her family have the reassurance knowing that she and her property will be safe.

Fall detector



If you fall when wearing a fall detector it will automatically send us an alert.

We will then get help on the way immediately without you having to do anything.

Among those who find our fall detectors useful are people with epilepsy and people who have had a stroke.

Jean has had epilepsy all her life and needs help if she has a seizure. With her Bupa fall detector she has the comfort of knowing that help will arrive quickly.



Passive motion detector



If there is no movement at a particular time and we know there should be, we can send help, following the plan we have agreed together.

Having recently suffered a stroke, Bert was very conscious of the possibility of another incident. His motion detector reassured Bert and his family that an ambulance would be sent if he had a stroke while sleeping and was unable to get out of bed.
